#### Join the big conversation focussing on your wellbeing

Right now, people working in health and social care are stretched and having to navigate significant challenges; they may be feeling tired and frustrated and they may not be prioritising their own wellbeing.

Be Well Midlands is hosting a 'Big Conversation' for everyone working in health and social care in the Midlands to talk about wellbeing by sharing thoughts, ideas and experiences in a safe and anonymous environment.

They are collaborating across 11 integrated care systems to identify how people working in health and social care are feeling right now, what is impacting most on their wellbeing, and what is needed to support their wellbeing. The insights drawn will identify opportunities for improvement where it is needed the most across the region.

You can take part by registering at <u>Be Well Midlands</u>. It is simple, all you need to do is enter your email address, and you will be sent (anonymously) a unique log in.

Everyone in health and care across the Midlands can contribute their views and experiences - by posting ideas, reading others' ideas as well as voting and commenting on other people's ideas. It is anonymous, so your name will not be attached to anything you share. It is entirely up to you how much time you spend on the platform. You can visit once or come back again and again - the platform is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week until 5pm on Friday 13 May. It is accessible from wherever you may be, on any computer, tablet or smartphone.

Please encourage your colleagues to participate too, as this is your chance to be heard and make improvements. You need to be well, to care well and you can have a real impact by taking part.

### Skills for care workforce planning and commissioning resource review

Skills for Care will be evaluating the following resources from May to September 2022:

- A practical guide for strategic workforce planning, shaping, and commissioning for commissioners
- Practical approaches to operational workforce planning for adult social care providers or commissioners to use with providers
- Workforce transformation outcomes measurement framework for adult social care providers and commissioners
- Social care workforce productivity and quality model for adult social care providers and commissioners

To facilitate this work, they would like to speak to employers or commissioners who have used any of these documents.
