

The Lord-Lieutenant's Award for Young People focuses on four key themes and nominations will need to demonstrate that the young person has made a contribution to society which meets the criteria set out below.

Young Braveheart of the Year

Awarded to an individual who has:

- overcome personal barriers to achieve success
- made a stand against bullying, racism etc.
- demonstrated a life-saving act of bravery

Young Volunteer of the Year

Awarded to an individual who has:

- enhanced their local community or environment
- cared for a neighbour or relative in need
- helped run a community or sports based club or society

Young Artist of the Year

The Joe Humphries **Memorial Award**

Awarded to a young person who demonstrates real skill, innovation, and expression in:

- visual arts
- expressive arts
- literature, or
- music

Most Improved Young Sports Person of the Year

Awarded to an individual who has:

- made significant progress in sport over the past 12 months
- demonstrated promise, dedication and determination
- exceeded expectations in their sporting performance or made a big difference to a team
