Special Educational Needs and Disparities (SEND) Resources

The Education and Training Foundation have some SEND support offers. There is a <u>SEND managers' programme</u> with two two-day modules; one on SEND knowledge (delivered by National Star College) and the second focuses on the leadership skills (delivered by the Leadership Centre). There is also a <u>specific needs</u> <u>programme on autism, dyslexia and hearing impairment</u> which provides an understanding of how best to work with learners with those particular needs. A new report by Education and Employers, Edge Foundation and National Union found that seven employability skills and five 'competencies' were most frequently cited by employers. #### T Level Action Plan

The **Department for Education** have now published the 2018 **T Level Action Plan.** The Plan announces which T Levels will roll out in 2021 and how providers will be selected to deliver these, clarifies outstanding T Level design issues, details the assurance and regulatory system for the Technical Qualifications within T Levels, and explains the workforce support that will be available from spring 2019.
